#### Special assessment process for serious criminal convictions

The National Redress Scheme (the Scheme) has a special assessment process that may apply to people with serious criminal convictions. A serious criminal conviction is a sentence of imprisonment for 5 years or more, for a single offence against a law of the Commonwealth, a state or territory or a foreign country.

You will need to go through the special assessment process if:

- (a) You have been sentenced to imprisonment for 5 years or more for unlawful killing, a sexual offence, a terrorism offence, or other related offences.
- (b) You have been sentenced to imprisonment for 5 years or more and the Scheme Operator has determined you should undergo the special assessment process.

A person with a serious criminal conviction must go through a special assessment process before they can be considered eligible to access redress under the Scheme.

If you are a person with a serious criminal conviction, the information requested in this form will help the Scheme decide if you have to undergo a special assessment process, and if so, to begin the special assessment process. If after considering the information you provide, the Scheme determines you are required to undergo a special assessment process because of either (a) or (b) above, we will inform you of the outcome.

If you have a serious criminal conviction, you need to complete this form, make a copy for your own records and return it to the Scheme. Until then, we will put your Application for Redress on hold until we hear from you or your redress nominee.

A reference in this form to 'the Act' is a reference to the National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse Act 2018.

**Part A** of this form asks for your personal information. We understand you may have already provided some of this information to the Scheme, however we need to ask for it again, with your informed consent, so we can conduct a Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check (NCCHC) through the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC). Information about the NCCHC is on page 10 of this form.

**Part B** of this form asks you to give information about factors related to your offence(s) and any other relevant factors, such as rehabilitation, you would like the Scheme Operator to consider.

If you are required to undergo a special assessment process, the results from the NCCHC, along with your Application for Redress and Part B of this form, will be sent to the Specified Advisor(s) in the jurisdiction(s) where you experienced abuse and were convicted of the offence. Where required, the Specified Advisor(s) will make a submission about your entitlement to redress under the Scheme. The Department of Social Services, in its role of supporting the National Redress Scheme Operator will look at the submission and also take into account:

- how the community would view your participation in the Scheme
- the nature of your offence and the length of imprisonment it carried
- the period of time since you committed the offence
- your rehabilitation, and
- any other relevant information.

We will contact you or your redress nominee to let you know if your Application for Redress can be assessed.

#### **Redress Support Services**

Redress Support Services are specialist community based services available to people applying to the Scheme. They can offer you information and support to complete this form. If you are in gaol, please note that access to support services may be limited.

#### Legal nominee

A legal nominee may complete **and sign** this form on your behalf.

If you are the **legal nominee**, you will need to write your Redress Nominee ID when signing this form. This ID starts with RN, followed by nine numbers. It appears on letters we send to redress nominees.

If you are not yet the assistant or legal nominee, you **must** complete the *Redress Nominee Form* before you can act on behalf of a person in the Scheme.



### Identity documents for NCCHC and ACIC

You will need to provide **three (3) identity documents** to help confirm who you are. For this to occur, one of the documents must be an accepted photo identity document that includes your date of birth.

- 1. The first document **must** be a 'commencement of identity document'.
- A commencement of identity document will normally be your:
  - full Australian Birth Certificate not an extract or birth card, and not a commemorative certificate.
  - current Australian Passport.
  - valid Australian Visa, which may be in the form of a Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO) record or printout.
  - Australian Citizenship Certificate.
  - official immigration record or a document issued by the Department of Home Affairs or the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (this may include an ImmiCard or a certificate of identity).
- 2. The second document **must** be a '**primary use in the community document**'.

#### A primary use in the community document may be:

- a current Australian driver licence, learner permit or provisional licence.
- a current foreign passport (with an accompanying Australia Visa).
- a current proof of age card or photo identity card issued by a government agency.
- a current shooter or firearm licence (not a minor or junior permit).
- an Australian marriage certificate not a church or celebrant issued certificate.
- 3. The third document **must** be a '**secondary use in the community document**'.

As a guide, you could provide:

- your Medicare card.
- evidence of your enrolment with the Australian Electoral Commission.
- a foreign government issued document such as a drivers licence, or marriage certificate.
